Winter Planting Calendar

Ornamentals to plant this season:

<u>Indoors</u>—Poinsettias, Christmas cacti, Cyclamen, Camellias, Azaleas <u>Outdoors</u>—CA native flowers, bareroot roses, Penstemon, Agapanthus **Outdoor food crops**

Artichokes, Asparagus, Beets & Carrots, Brassicas or "cole crops" (turnips, broccoli, cabbage, radishes), Lettuce & Spinach, Onions, Parsnips, Potato, Horseradish, Rhubarb & Strawberries, Herbs (borage, chives, parsley, rosemary, French thyme). Whew!

Know Your Average First Frost Date

It's good to know your "first frost date" if you want to garden in the winter, because planting early enough will help your garden survive the frost. While there's no *guaranteed* "first frost date", we can make an educated guess about when it will occur in our area by looking at historical data. The information linked to below is calculated using 1981-2010 Climate Normals from NOAA weather stations around the county.

How do I read these charts?

The chart below, for Lompoc's first frost date, shows that there's a 50% chance the first frost (temperature at or below 32 degrees F) will happen *on or before* December 14. There is a 90% chance it will occur by January 16.
