Notorious Pests Sighted in Santa Barbara County

- <u>Threat to Citrus Trees</u>: Asian Citrus Psyllid, or ACP (*Diaphorina citri*) can transmit a deadly citrus disease named Huanglongbing or HLB ("citrus greening disease"). The pest (ACP) is in Santa Barbara County, but the disease (HLB) is not...yet. Inspect your trees for ACP to help our local growers! *Learn more:* californiacitrusthreat.org
- <u>The BFF you don't want</u>: The Black Fig Fly (Silba adipata) was first detected in California/Santa Barbara



County in June 2021. Adult BFFs lay eggs in unripe figs, which larvae exit through a small hole. *Help prevent the BFF's spread: Please don't move locally grown fig fruit from Santa Barbara County.* Report observations of this pest by calling the **CDFA Pest Hotline** at 1-800-491-1899 or by visiting the site below: <u>www.cdfa.ca.gov/plant/reportapest/</u>.

Small Beetle, Big Problem: Invasive Shothole Borers

(ISHB) are small beetles that carry a deadly disease called Fusarium Dieback (FD). ISHB-FD infects <u>hundreds of tree</u> <u>species</u> and has killed thousands of trees in SoCal. It's moving north in our county, with increasing detections in the Santa Ynez area.
