Container Gardening Demos in Isla Vista

On Tuesday, July 12, UC Master Gardeners partnered with the **Housing Authority of the County of Santa Barbara (HASBARCO)** to provide clientele with a demonstration, talk, and hands-on planting workshop. Five residents of The Lofts in Isla Vista learned about container options and how to care for plants that fit with their housing situations. They each walked away with several herbs, pelargoniums, and/or succulents to grow in their window, balcony, or patio.
